"Neil "Lyons advised the meeting about his future experiment putting a 650 "holley onto a 4-"Barrell Manifold.


"Neil "Lyons advised the meeting that a 1966 "Austin 1800 Bonnet Cable will fit a "Leyland.



INSURANCE MAY NOT GIVE ASSURANCE.

How many people have found the limits of their insurance cover too late? I have, and nearly lost my Leyland P76 Targa Florio as a result of a unwritten policy by VACC insurance.

The features we must look for in insurance cover could include the following...

- i) Agreed Value of your vehicle.
- ii) Retention of salvage rights on the vehicle in the event of a write-off.
- iii) Retention of insurance rating in the event of a no fault claim.
- iv) Towing and storage fees covered by insurance.
- v) Your choice of a competitively priced repairer.
- vi) Replacement vehicle whilst your vehicle is off the road.
- vii) Possible accommodation costs covered if you are stranded in an isolated area.
- viii) Insurance coverage for modified roadworthy vehicles.

Check your cover to make sure that your insurance covers what you want it to as well check for unwritten policies. In my case I was involved in a accident resulting from hitting a large wombat, obviously I was not at fault yet I lost my rating 1 because I made a claim, I also nearly lost the car because VACC has a unwritten policy that wrecks become their property and must be tendered for, or else go to auction. The tendering system is somewhat questionable as it appears that the insurance company and certain wreckers have a system whereby if the owner shows interest in keeping the wreck the wrecker will put in a highly inflated tender. In my case the wrecker tender was in vicinity of \$800 for a written off P76, at a time when whole complete running cars were still selling for only slightly more. I also had insured the vehicle for \$5,500 yet when the claim was made the insurance company refused to pay any more than \$4,000 less the \$375 excess and \$850 for the wreck.

Results of research into insurance cover..

VGL and Shannons Insurance Companies seem to have the type of cover people with a P76 who wish to insure their car may need. Whilst not providing everything in the above list at least you can be assured that in the event of a write-off you will keep the wreck and get the amount of money that was agreed to be the value of the vehicle. The only thing owners will have to do occasionally is make sure that they have adequate cover.

AUTOMATIC TRANSMISSION DIPSTICK

P76 SIX CYLINDER


There have been a few instances of incorrectly manufactured dipsticks being supplied with vehicles. This relates to dipstick length, and details were given previously in Service Bulletins C18/73 and C22/73. Complaints of transmission slippage can arise from this condition.

Your full support is requested to ensure that dipsticks are checked on all P76 Automatic Vehicles when being serviced in your Workshops.

Where measurements do not coincide with those shown on the accompanying diagram, the dipstick should be replaced with:

8 Cylinder engines 6 Cylinder engines

Part No. AYB.3056 Part No. AYB.3287



It is also of the <u>UTMOST IMPORTANCE</u> that the transmission be topped up to the correct level before being returned to owner. For this purpose the dipstick can be remarked, but only as a temporary measure pending replacement.

Current production six cylinder vehicles are fitted with the V8 fuel gauge tank unit and a vapour separator AYB0492 to overcome complaints of vapour lock.

To overcome this condition in earlier production vehicles the following parts are required:-

1 x AYB0493 - Pipe assy. Pump outlet to carb.

2 x SYC0003 - Clip

1 x AYB0492 - Vapour Separator

1 x AYD2101 - Fuel gauge unit

1 x AYD2085 - Return fuel pipe - separator to joint hose

x AYD2100 - Hose - vapour separator to inlet pipe

x SYC0017 - Clip - hose to pipe

x AYD2092 - Hose joint - return pipe

x AYD2086 - Hose joint - return fuel pipe to tank

x AYH2691 - Rubber sleeve - return pipe

x MYH1156 - Pipe clip - 5/16" x 3/16" - feed pipe to return pipe.

x AYD2101 - Fuel gauge unit.
