Grevillea Place Stanwell Tops Christian Conference Centre off Bendena Gardens Road Stanwell Tops, NSW phone (042) 94 1430

Grevillea Place is part of the 38 hectare Centre, and accommodates 130 people in 26 hostel-type rooms with double bunks. It includes a dining room, lecture room, games room, sporting fields and a swimming pool. Linen is not provided but can be hired at extra cost. The Centre advises that due to its charter, the consumption of alcohol on the grounds or in the buildings is not permitted.

In order to make the weekend a financial possibility for as many people as possible, we have kept the costs to an absolute minimum and are covering as much as we can from fund-raising and donations prior to the event. This means that once you have paid your registration fees, all activities other than the optional Saturday night and Sunday tours are FREE!!! A copy of "Anything But Average" is also included in the registration fee - further copies will be available for sale.
