
Trip to Russell Island



## P76 Interchangeable Parts and Tech Tips Manual

As you may recall my father and I mentioned that I'm putting together a Manual of interchangeable P76 parts and tech tips. The idea behind the manual is to bring together information on interchangeable parts for the six and eight cylinder models along with appropriate technical tips and handy ideas that will prove useful to the P76 owner.

There is information that owners have accumulated about our cars, that is not being communicated or made readily available to other owners to help keep our worthy cars at their best. As you know I'm on my second restoration of a P76 and I like others have learnt some tricks along the way. Many owners don't know what fan belt to buy or the type of automatic transmission oil to use in their car, or what handy tips are known to make a job easer.

I'm only interested in parts and tech tips that owners have used themselves and not hearsay. Where possible suspect information will be investigated for substantiation.

The manual will be made available to the Queensland Club if it so wishes at cost, for resale at a profit to interested owners (no royalties payable).

I strongly believe that there is a need to formalise the mass of information available other than that which Tony De Luca has documented and what is generally available in workshop manuals.

I ask that the Club assist by way of placing a request for information in the Club Magazine. I will acknowledge clubs that help to contribute information as well as organisations and individuals of significant help. May I suggest the following for the magazine on the accompanying page. Known to make strange noises sometimes resembling mechanical problems when idling. To check, lubricate with soap or spray with WD 40. If noises continue investigate further as you may have a mechanical problem.

Carburettor with LPG

The accelerator pump piston in the carburettor will become worn when running on LPG as it will not be lubricated by petrol. This will create a flat spot when running on petrol during acceleration. Replace accelerator pump piston if you plan to run on petrol. If flooding of the carburettor is a problem, due likely to be caused by needle valve leakage due to foreign matter build up, ie, lack of use as running on LPG. Clean Carburettor.
