Narangba club pays homage to a

Road Dinosaur

It may be hard to believe, but Narangba's Graham "Rogo" Rodgerson loves nothing more than the sight and sound of a Leyland P76. Graham and his mates in the Leyland P76 Club are on a mission to stop some of the nasty propaganda spread about this dinosaur of the road, considered by many to be the worst car built in Australia.

"You've probably heard them all," Graham said shaking his head.



"Like people would call them a P-38 because they're only half a car.

There not perfect but I don't understar why they've got such a bad name.

They won Wheels (magazine) car of the

year in 1974 and that's a pretty prestigious award."

As far as fans would go, it would be hard to beat Graham. He has driven a P-76 for the past 22 years and his backyard is littered with at least 10 in various states of repair.

"I'm the spare parts man for the club and we only sell to club members," he said.

The history of the P76 is a short one. They were built in Australia in 1973 and 1974, with a handful assembled in New Zealand until 1975.

"They were totally designed and built here in Australia," Graham said.

"The only thing British about them was the name because Leyland put up the money to build them."

But crippled by industrial disputes in the Sydney plant and a push for smaller cars the marketplace, P76 production stopped.

"And that's the whole story - they just shut the whole program down after two years," Graham said.

Like many other car enthusiasts, P76 club members are faced by parts shortages and have been forced to either make new panels or adapt pieces from other makes.

"they'll take Holden pistons for example," Graham said.

He said it was an enjoyable car to restore and drive as a hobby, with a good example costing between just \$5000 and \$12,000.

Produced with a range of six-cylinder and V8 models, the P76 was well ahead of its time in terms of safety features alone, Graham said.

"Like your Mercedes and Volvo's today, the P76 had (side-impact) bars in the doors for protection," he said.

"We rolled one with a campervan on the back and the car was a write-off, but we walked away. They're bloody magnificent cars."



A DIFFERENT INVESTMENT

Off the NET:

Dear Mr Ober,

I am writing reguarding a most interesting proposal that i believe is just the sort of thing that you would be interested in. Agroup of us are considering investing in a large cat ranch near Hermosille, Mexico. It is our purpose to start rather small, with about one million cats. Each cat averages about twelve kittens per year, skins can be sold for about 20 cents for the white ones and up to 40 cents for the black. This will give us 12 million cat skins per year to sell at an average price of around 32 cents, making our revenue about \$3,000,000 a year. Let me know if you are interested; as you can imagine, I am rather particular who I want to get into this, and I want the fewer investors possible. Eventually it is my hope to cross the cats with snakes for they will skin themslves twice a year!. This will ave the labour costs of skinning as well as give us two skins for one cat. May I hear from you at your earliest opportunity with a certified check to my order?


