

2005 MARCH GENERAL MEETING MINUTES


The President opened the meeting at 8.02 pm.

Already talks are in progress regarding pulling the factory down for re development. Next week I will send the club the handbook that was with my Force 7 and the identity tag British Leyland's used for the spare keys.

Got a call from a guy who has 44 exp 1057, (and > wants to sell it) > experimental bench test motor for Leyland P76, used by REPCO to test bearing rings and pistons, for Leyland Australia, very interesting motor rover heads see photos), P block, I am advised by Nigel Tait from ACL (automotive components limited, who bought REPCO) that the engines were typically run at wide open throttle for 300 hrs, and came through very well. 

FOR SALE

My P76 is actually my Father in laws (Leo), we (the Family) are bringing it back to life for him while he can still drive, he is getting on in his years. Leo has had the car since new, he was employed at Zetland for a period of 18yrs, and when they closed he was a senior engineer in the 'Experimental Department', he also did quite a bit of reliability testing of the vehicles. His P76 is a super six, column auto, country cream, imperial leather, with electric aerial, air sticker on the rear window with the polar bear, but no air! Force 7 drivers side door mirror, a pair of 'experimental' door aperture finishers (the top section of these being twice as thick as the ones commonly used), drivers side only (these are being replaced, but I will keep the 'experimental' ones aside). Force 7 steering wheel, and 5 'experimental' Targa rims! They have the camphered edge on the inside, but they do need a spacer plate, dark brown vinyl roof (made from Moke canopy material) and NO 'c' pillar vents, the vinyl roof has gone, and the 'c' pillar vents are back. The car has not been driven for over 4 years, it was under a carport, but the harsh weather in this area, Albury/Wodonga has totally faded the tail lights (nos purchased through e-bay) and taken it's toll on the rear bumper (getting re-chromed), the body is in exceptional condition (the same cant be said for the interior), considering the life it has had towing horse floats around to various equine events for the kids. No signs of any rust to really mention, just a little surface rust underneath the tail light corner panels was all. It is a June 73 build, with drivers side fuse box, passenger side battery, the owners manual is 855B > 12/73 which I believe (according to Rick in Vic) was the first to show air conditioning. Chassis number (also by Rick) puts the car as the second super six column auto of 'normal' production. I am making a trip to Melbourne in the next few weeks, I have Rick's details as I will be joining the Victorian Club.
