I am currently in the process of doing up my late Nanna's 1973 green deluxe six. Nanna and Pop bought it brand new from Delta Motors in the Burdekin and had it as the family car on the cane farm out of Brandon, North Queensland. It remained parked in the shed when not out running around town getting the family's groceries and bags of Lucien and old stale loafs of bread for the horses and cows.

It stayed on the farm till Nanna passed away and Dad gave it to my Auntie down in Maitland, New South Wales as she was in need of a car. She drove it down from the farm in Queensland. We used to go down and visit on school holidays every couple of years. The car stayed with Auntie Margie for years. She drove it around down there on their small vineyard and everywhere else they went without any problems and she continued to take good care of it.

She got a newer small car to drive around more easily after her husband was tragically killed. The Leyland got parked in the shed as she moved off the vineyard into town near Kurri Kurri. Her sons used it from time to time to keep it running and it was a handy spare car. After a while it just sat in the shed for a few years. As her health was failing, her daughter and family moved in to look after her. Mum and Dad had been down to visit a couple of times and the family had been talking about what to do with her cars as she couldn't drive anymore and wanted sell them.



I had left home and had been living in Perth for 3 years when this happened. Dad and I were talking about the Leyland. On their next trip down south to see my Auntie, I asked him to see if the Leyland was still there as I wanted to keep it in the family. I was in luck as she was still parked in the shed. So early last year I flew back home to Queensland and Dad and I drove down to see my Auntie and her family and to pick up the Leyland. We hired a car trailer down there and loaded it on. We stayed the night and made a fresh start for home the next morning. When we arrived home I was keen to get it going as it was running when they last drove it into the shed 5 years ago!! We filled up the brake master cylinder and bled the brakes (they had leaked out were not working) so we could safely roll her off the trailer.
